#### MACCW President Report November 10, 2024

Dear Reverend Father and Sisters in Christ:

The last few months have been remarkably busy. Representing MACCW makes me realize how much I love the Council.

During June 13 & 14, I attended the FCCW Board meeting in Orlando. I was introduced as the new MACCW President. That was a very productive session, I not only learned about what the other Deanery were doing but also, Dorothy Harper, Palm Beach's DCCW President approached me, and asked me to participate as one of the speakers for their 2025 convention.

On June 17, I attended an Amendment 4 committee meeting, invited by Katie Blanco, President ADOM Development Corporation. The following individuals also attended the meeting: Stephen Colella, Juan Di Prado, Jim Rigg, Angela Curatalo, Michelle Jurado, Fr. Agustin Estrada, Lorenzo Rodriguez, Sister Elizabeth Worley, and Archbishop Wenski. The meeting was very productive regarding the strategies that the Archdiocese is implementing to help defeat Amendment 4.

On June 18, Father Greer and I had a private meeting with Archbishop Wenski, where we talked about the future of MACCW and the need to recruit more member. I requested to have a letter signed by him talking about the great service that the Council provides to our churches, and I am happy to report that he said yes! We have the letter, and it has been sent to the Archdiocese priests.

On July 7<sup>th</sup>, I reported to FCCW Legislative Advocacy Chair Maria Knoll about MACCW Pro-Life Activities.

On July 25th, I attended the Grassroots Bi-Weekly call (Sara Johnson-main speaker).

On August 13<sup>th</sup>, I arrived in Oklahoma City for the NCCW Convention. I had such a wonderful time. The speakers were amazing. The LTD team gave an outstanding presentation. I met a group of wonderful ladies creating such a spiritual bond that lasted throughout the whole event. The Liturgies were very uplifting. The President and President elect were impressive, and they made sure that every detail was perfect. The music was nice, dear Father Miguel sand beautifully, the food was excellent, they had young girls (teens) attending, and all these together melted my heart seeing the young generation attending.

On August 25<sup>th</sup>, after a pause because of COVID, we had our beautiful Layette Mass (former Haitian Mass). I want to give a big thank you to Our Lady of Lourdes team ad their president Ceci Cantu, for all the long hours planning and making sure that we had everything under control. I also want to thank our Coordinator, Elizabeth Samuels, who always made sure of all the logistics and details. It was such a lovely time, meeting the 3 ladies that we showered knowing the hardship they had and the desire to keep their pregnancy amid the health issues (eclampsia, car accident, etc.). I am pleased to report all three babies were born, and the moms and babies are healthy. They shared pictures with me asking me to tell all of you that they are forever grateful for all the gifts. I have wonderful news, one of the mothers reached out to me asking for help because she wants to baptize her son. This is an amazing way to evangelize. For the first time, we can follow up with the ladies we help. God placed these ladies in our hands, and we are now able to continue our mission of Catholic ladies.

On August 29<sup>th</sup>, I had a meeting with my pastor Father Arias. I talked about Amendment 4 and told him about what the CCW was doing. He liked the idea and now we have on our parish website videos, Say No to 4 explanation and we are playing the video after Mass twice a month. I told Father about voter registration, and he gave me the go ahead to do it. I contacted the election department about doing an Outreach Voter Registration in our parish, which will take place on Friday, September 27 and Saturday, September 28<sup>th</sup>. The Voter Outreach was from 4:30 to 8:00pm.

On September 9<sup>th</sup>, I attended the Statewide Vote No on 4, via Zoom, with Sara Johnson as the speaker. There were so many people trying to attend that they created a second Zoom to accommodate the ones that could not log in because the meeting was at capacity.

October 16<sup>th</sup>, I submitted a report to Maria Knoll for the State Pro Life Coordinating Committee about all the wonderful job that our Districts have been doing.

October 24<sup>th</sup> to October 27<sup>th</sup> I attended FCCW Conference in Tampa. Despite the challenges posed by two hurricanes the conference was an inspiring experience. The speakers were phenomenal, each sharing profound insight, covering a range of topics leaving the audience both encouraged and challenged to grow spiritually.

## Central District of the Miami Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women President's Report

I worked with Fr. Michael Greer, MACCW Spiritual Advisor, to find a replacement for Fr. Christopher Marino, who was our Central District Spiritual Advisor, who now is at St. Mary Star of the Sea in Key West. I am pleased to announce that Fr. Luis Perez has been appointed to be our new Spiritual Advisor.

I attended the Florida Council of Catholic Women 26<sup>th</sup> Biennial Conference, on October 24th to 28th. I enjoyed the welcome mystery dinner theater party at Nativity Parish Hall. There were about 20 + tables and each table had to choose who the murderer was. I was at table 9 and we were the only table with the correct answer. It was fun, and more fun to win! The theme of the Conference was "Go in Peace Glorifying the Lord by Your Life." The speakers were fantastic. My favorite speaker was Msgr. Stephen Bosso. He spoke on the words of the Conference Theme. He talked about the word PEACE and its origins from Shalom and its meanings. Msgr. Bosso explained that as a noun "Shalom" means completeness, soundness, welfare, prosperity, be well, and peace. He added that as a verb "Shalem" means to be complete or to be sound, finished, ended, to be safe, unharmed, peaceful. He noted that, liturgically the word "peace" is used 16X's. Words are important.

The Central District held their Fall General Meeting and Breakfast, on November 2, 2024. The meeting was hosted by St. Rose of Lima Council of Catholic Women in their Parish Cafeteria. Fr. Luis Perez was officially installed by Fr. Greer, as our District Spiritual Advisor. Both Priests had messages to share with us. I returned yesterday from attending the 26th biennial conference of the Florida Council of Catholic Women Tampa hosted by the St Petersburg diocesan CCW "Go in peace glorifying the Lord by your life," Was the theme for this great event. Brenda Dolan, province director of Florida CCW, greeted us along with now FCCW president elect Melissa Garrett (Missy) and chairman for this conference. Brenda could not be any sweeter, and Missy is very excited and ready to take on her new role. The Sheraton hotel in Brandon Tampa was a nice venue. We were surrounded by vendors with lots of novelty items, jewelry, etc. There was a lovely shrine with our Blessed Mother Mary at the entrance of the conference room, and the ladies also set up a very peaceful room for prayer. We also heard from two really nice CCW ladies, Susie and Laurie, that spoke to us about being a positive influence, by using a paper doll prompting us to answer questions about how we see ourselves, and what our views are towards what we do in our affiliations. Very simple, yet very important.

We also heard via Zoom a message from Amy Kennedy, National CCW president elect, her theme "why we gather." she highlighted the importance of Make a personal sincere invite, not to be discouraged if the answer is no, and to share your own CCW story in order to attract new members to our affiliations.

She emphasized the reasons for gathering, sharing our faith, joy, and hope! It was refreshing to hear her message.

And of course, I must mention one of our own, Dr. Mary Jo O'Sullivan who spoke about her professional life experience in reference to how medications made their way into the abortion business and how babies in the womb feel pain and experience fear during this very sad procedure.
