This year we need to honor our women. They have grown in faith by keeping their spirituality alive and connecting to the church. Their dedication to God, family, and community has been outstanding. They serve and evangelize with the love of Christ while entrusting this mission to Mary our Blessed Mother. We can cite so many wonderful examples of outstanding jobs, such as awarding four \$500 college scholarships to four deserving seniors. Another example is the 2487 hours spent producing about 2500 rosaries each year. This event is as original as the one in October when members decided to make “a larger than life rosary” where each decade had its own colored “ball-pit” plastic bead and the other prayer beads were also color coordinated; they were strung together with rope. This allowed each member to hold a bead and say a prayer in turn while sitting in a large circle. Another parish collected \$1,640 in gift cards that were donated to the Covenant House. As we can see, the cleverness of our ladies goes from supervising the scheduling of the Vocational Chalice for weekend masses to visiting homebound, nursing homes, and driving the elderly to appointments. Shopping, volunteering, and hosting were also involved. CCW meetings, palm braiding, keeping churches beautiful with flowers and decorations, make us realize that “women are the backbone of the church”.

Blessings to ALL the members of the CCW Affiliations for your dedication and service to support and aide in your Community. This past year has been difficult for many families. Many families have to decide to buy food or pay the utility bill. Many women are taking on two jobs because there husbands have lost there jobs and they still can't make ends meet. I am proud to announce that many of our affiliations are all helping by raising money with Bingo, Bunco, Flea Markets, Gift Shops, white elephant sales, bake sales and dinners for food for St. Vincent DePaul, local panties, scholarships to allow children to have a catholic education. Affiliations made Thanksgiving possible for hundreds of family in their community by collecting food after Mass and at General Meeting and by involving the Catholic School in their Parish to donate food and make baskets. Phone cards were collected and set over to our Military service personnel to keep in touch with families back home. A clever Parish, made Easter Baskets to give to an out reach center. Slightly used boots and long sleeve shirts were also sent to Catholic Relieve Service to distribute to farm workers. Collecting cloths for children during the holidays is a popular event, and many, many more programs.

When looking back on a year it seems many of us have the same thought: "Where did the time go?" Well, if you look at all the things that the ladies of the MACCW have done; you will change that thought to "How in the world did they find the time!" They reach out to families in all aspects of life and do it with a smile.

Many of the affiliations are very active in Respect Life. There were 10 baby showers, members attending the Respect Life Convention, still more ladies taking part in Catholic Days at the Capitol Days in Tallahassee, the Life Chain, Chastity Days and on the front lines volunteering in the local pregnancy centers. The Haitian Mass/Baby shower was a huge success in helping four girls and their little babies. Lives are saved and changed by acts of love the CCW women show everyday.

Several groups are involved in setting up receptions for the First Communion classes, organizing parish picnics, some are teaching CFF programs, and Baptism Preparation classes. Many give monetary donation to keep the CFF programs going. We have youth directors, volunteers who help in their schools with Red Ribbon week or a teacher appreciation lunch. As you know with our wonderful scholarship committee four \$6000 scholarships were given out to girls going on to Catholic High School. Some affiliations also provide scholarships to girls at their own schools. All of this effort lets the schools and the CFF programs know that CCW is here to help.

Stepping out from our parish grounds we find many families in need. We have several affiliations working with St. Vincent de Paul or their own parish food pantry. They work together to provide Thanksgiving Day dinners and referrals to shelters for the homeless.

In addition, groups are cooking and taking meals to families in need, volunteering at soup kitchens, and caring for the elderly and the homebound. Many of our sister council members are involved in supporting girls shelters or safe homes for women. They create hygiene bags for them, Christmas gifts, Valentine treats, Mothers Day gifts and even Easter baskets. I was amazed and touch to read about one council group

that hosts several homeless families for a WEEK in their parish hall. They provide food, clothing, shelter and activities for a whole week. This gives the families time to be a family. Things that I for one take for granted at times. I am sure being a part of such an event is very rewarding. They do this TWICE a year.

As you know we have taken on a new program called Hugs for the Homeless. The program came up kind of quick this year however was successful. I am sure next year will be bigger and better

I am continually awed by the amount of caring and concern shown by the women of the CCW everyday. It amazes me at what needs to be done sometimes just outside our front door. We have an opportunity everyday to make a difference in a family's life and you do it! I am honored to be part of such an awesome group of women and look forward to seeing what amazing act of charity you make the coming year. Summing up all the efforts of the MACCW affiliations has revealed that we as a group have put our faith into action. From the affiliation reports, a total of 4,747 hours were reported under legislation commission.

As we thank God for giving us the opportunity to make a difference, not only in our local community, state and nation, we have received the message from Archbishop Wenski to recall and proclaim that Jesus is the way. Archbishop Wenski's homily at the MACCW 53rd Annual Convention, told us that if we live our Catholic faith in a coherent and unapologetic way we will be men and women of the way.

In the upcoming council year, I believe that we will be called upon to be the voice for the promotion of human dignity, which includes:

- Matters of life from natural conception to natural death
- Campaign for the advancement of immigration reform through education of ourselves and others
- Prayer to strengthen marriages and families
- Opposition to same sex marriage

2012 will be an election year. Let us plan now that we will collectively respond to the statement from Archbishop Wenski to put a voice behind our faith and to be in the way of those that think religious faith has no place in the pulpit or the public arena.

FCC Advocacy Network

In response to six state and three federal alerts since the start of 2011, nearly 12,000 electronic messages were sent through their online system.

International

We had an amazing year for International Concerns. You, the Ladies of MACCW, collected eyeglasses, empty pill bottles, wheelchairs, walkers, and stamps that were sent to missions in need around the world.

Rosaries were also made and sent to African Missions. Some were sent to the Gulf Task Force for fishermen, workers and families that were affected by the Gulf Oil spill. Food for the Poor was supported with monetary donations for food and supplies plus enough money to build a double house and cistern in Haiti.

Two houses were built in Nicaragua and one orphan child is being supported in Nicaragua. Cash donations were also made to Haiti and Chilean Earthquake Relief funds. Food, clothing and bedding were also sent to Haiti.

Donations were sent to a Mission in India to help build a school. Donations were also sent to Help a Child, Madonna Plan, Water for Life and the Human Trafficking Fund.

A food and toy drive was held to help Migrant Workers. Sales of Fair Trade items, including coffee and chocolate were encouraged through the Work of Human Hands.

Thank you to those who supported the booth at Convention. A special fundraiser at Convention raised \$200.00 for Sr. Alonzo of St Vincent de Paul and the Daughters of Charity's Mission in Haiti through the sale of tissue box covers.

A very special thank you to everyone who made all these good works happen. Total volunteer hours donated were approximately 4500.

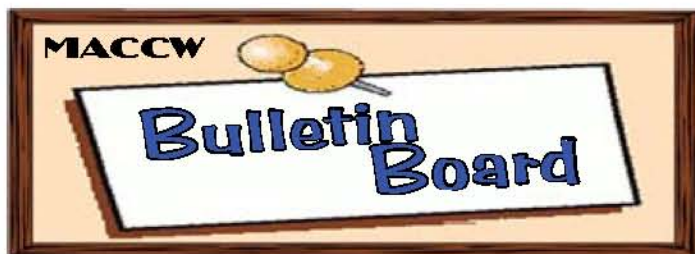

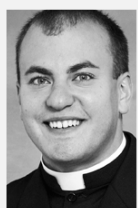

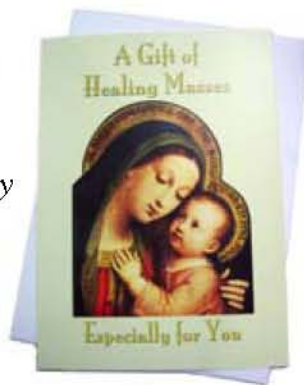
