

The second, Educational Choice HB 1/SB 202 was ready for us to present it. and a few weeks after Governor DeSantis signed the bill into a law.

After so many trips to Tallahassee discussing with lawmakers, with the help of all the volunteers participating in this year's CDC and the ones who participated before, we got the satisfaction of seeing firsthand our hard work turned into a win.

If it is any lesson that we need to teach our CCW sisters is that perseverance pays off. That our presence may be the one little drop needed to fill the cup and make this happen.

April 29th was our 65th Celebration Meeting at the Ft. Lauderdale Embassy Suites. I had the pleasure to be the Toastmistress for the afternoon.


It was so nice to see our own Daniela Martinez's daughter, Sara, win the Golden Rose Award, along with the other very deserving lady Khloe Paredes.

### Service

MACCW supports various service projects, including NCCW's Madonna Plan and Water for Life in partnership with Catholic Relief Services. MACCW is no longer collecting money for the Change for Change and Help a Child program, as NCCW no longer supports these. We are still supporting the Vocation Purse Club in partnership with The National Fund for Catholic Religious Vocations (NFCRV).

The Vocation Purse Club assists women seeking to enter religious life with their financial obstacles. While vocation numbers have increased, many continue to be derailed or deferred due to educational debt. The average candidate to religious life owes \$33K in student loans, a great burden for many religious communities. Your support can directly help young Catholic women pursue their dream and realize their vocation of becoming religious sisters and nuns as they focus their lives on service, spirituality, and leadership - which are the pillars of NCCW!

#### MADONNA PLAN

Since 1958, the Madonna Plan has supported Catholic Relief Service's Child Survival Project, which works with pregnant women and women with children under age 5. The project addresses healthy behaviors and provides needed health services, such as vaccinations and immunizations to pregnant women and their children, as well as support

groups for breastfeeding mothers.





#### WATER FOR LIFE

The Water for Life program was established in 1978 to make safe and clean water available to women and their families in developing countries. Historically, the program has funded wells in villages throughout Africa and Latin America for the development of stronger communities by establishing irrigation, sanitation systems and basic hygiene education.

### Legislation

MACCW has been urging for members to participate in the Catholic Days at the Capitol (CDAC) for many years and as part of our legacies in the Archdiocese of Miami.

CDAC are days designated by Florida Bishops for Catholic men and women of Florida to gather at the state capitol and put their faith and civic responsibility into action. This is a yearly event at the beginning of the Florida Legislative Session. This year we had thirtynine participants at CDAC from the Archdiocese of Miami, twenty of them were women of MACCW. This year CDAC Priorities are:

Abortion Limits: HB 7 (Persons-Mulicka) / SB 300 (Grall) would protect women and preborn children from abortion after six weeks gestation, as well as regulate chemical abortions. House: Passed 70-40; Senate: Passed 26-13; Signed by the Governor: April 13, 2023 Prohibits abortion in Florida after six-weeks' gestation, with exceptions; includes \$25 million in funding to provide pregnancy and parenting support to women and their families; also prohibits state funds from assisting women traveling out of state to obtain an abortion and telehealth from being used to provide abortion services. Supported by FLCCB

<u>Educational Choice</u>: HB 1 (Tuck) / SB 202 (Simon) would make educational savings accounts (ESAs) available to all families, including homeschooled students, regardless of income. House: Passed <u>83-27</u>; Senate: Passed <u>26-12</u>; Signed by the Governor: <u>March</u>

<u>27, 2023</u> Expands state scholarship programs so that education savings accounts (ESAs) are available to all students eligible to attend a public school in Florida, including homeschool students; also expands access to larger scholarships for students with disabilities by increasing the enrollment cap. **Supported by FLCCB** 

<u>Unanimous Juries in Capital Sentencing</u>: HB 555 (Jacques) / SB 450 (Ingoglia) would repeal current provisions requiring a jury to be unanimous to recommend a death sentence and require that only eight of the twelve jurors recommend death. House: Passed 80-30; Senate: Passed 29-10; Signed by the Governor: <u>April 20, 2023</u> Repeals current law that requires a jury to be unanimous in recommending a death sentence; instead requires that a recommendation by only 8 of 12 jurors is necessary to impose a sentence of death. **Opposed by FLCCB** 

My sincere gratitude to all participants and please save the date for the 2024 CDAC, February 6<sup>th</sup> through the 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

MACCW constantly encourages our women to be involved in programs or public policy issues pertaining to life, dignity and the common good. We encourage our women to be part of the Florida Catholic Advocacy Network. FLCAN is a statewide, online community established by the Bishops of Florida that exists to connect, educate, and mobilize Catholics across Florida's seven dioceses on public policy issues pertaining to life, dignity, and the common good. 
