


**MACCW** Spiritual Advisor Very Rev. Michael J. Greer, V.F.

## **Spirituality**

Very often when I am out and about, I see people traveling with water bottles, some of which are made of BPA free plastic and others are made of stainless steel. Such bottles are used for various purposes, one of which is to remain hydrated.

Hydration is currently a major health concern; yet many people fail to meet the daily fluid recommendation necessary for the body to function as it should. The failure to meet this requirement is called dehydration.

Physical dehydration also occurs when we use or lose more fluid than we take in; consequently, the body does not have enough water or other fluids in its system to carry out its normal functions. Hence, when we suffer from physical dehydration, it is critical that we rehydrate as quickly as possible by drinking plenty of fluids and eating foods high in water content such as fruits and vegetables.

As human beings, we have a physical nature and a spiritual nature. The physical identifies with the material world, and the spiritual interacts with God and the spiritual realm. And just as we become dehydrated in our physical, we also become dehydrated in our spiritual. So, what do you do when you experience spiritual dehydration? What do we do when the soul is thirsty, and the spirit is dry? What do we do when our faith wavers, our hope falls into despair, and we are not inclined to pray? Just as in physical dehydration we drink plenty of fluids and eat foods high in water content, Jesus invites us to come Him and drink of that life giving stream. We are told that whoever drinks of the water He has to offer they will never

thirst, for the water that He offers becomes in us a spring of water welling up to eternal life.
