I was lucky enough to meet some wonderful people in the last several months who help others with full conviction and


selflessness and humility. I was lucky enough to meet people who worked at Women in Distress, Kids in Distress, Covenant House, Hope South FL, Catholic Charities of Palm Beach and a doctor from See your Future, whom I am already friends with.

Where I am going with this, is I was lucky enough to spend time with and talk with directors of all of these foundations, and I learn something new every time we speak. The new foundation I just learned about is with someone I have known for some time but was not aware of this and she was not aware of the knowledge I had about human trafficking. An eye doctor, Dr Bita Sabipour whom I have known for many years gave me her "other" business card and it had on it See your Future. I asked her what it was about, and she said I help underprivileged children and adults and human trafficking victims with free eye exams and free glasses. We then of course talked about what we each knew, then she called me and invited me to come to her office and hear some young ladies from Catholic Charites speak to her interns. She wanted the interns to understand about the victims she helps and learn more of a background about what they had been through. Dr. Sabipour's foundation "See Your Future" has done dozens of free cases with these victims and explained how one victim would not let her take her glasses off of her face to examine her and when she finally got her to talk the victim told her that how they kept her to keep doing what they wanted her to do was take her glasses away from her and would only give them back when she raised enough money for the day as you would say her "quota", she could not see more than a foot in front of her without her glasses. (Read testimonial of another survivor) Dr. Sabipour told me she also works with other doctors in another foundation who are pediatricians, OBGYNs, GPs and other doctors who all treat these victims for free and do all they can to help.

The young lady she introduced me to was Joanna Bejarano form Catholic Charites of Palm Beach and another young lady who are case managers, she told us several stories of the survivors of human trafficking that they have counseled. These young ladies are only in their late 20s and deal with many types of victims but especially human trafficking survivors. I told them they are so brave to be able to help people come out of the worst nightmare anyone can go through and be able to hold onto themselves as it cannot be easy to go home every night and leave that behind. They say there are angels behind every door, I have met so many in the past few months that it gives me hope to know that there are so many people helping others. We don't realize that we are one of them. These young ladies said because we talk to people about this we pass on the word that other people learn from us and the more educated people are the more help those in captive a chance to be helped & to be found.
